



HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE BOARD 11th February, The Feast Day of Our Lady of Lourdes, World Day of the Sick



Sunday is the anniversary of the first vision of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, to the little girl, Bernadette Soubirous. Thirty years ago, Saint John Paul II started the World Day of the Sick on this day of the solemnity of Our Lady of Lourdes. The World Day of the Sick is an awareness day,

or a special regard, in the Catholic Church intended for "prayer and sharing, of offering one's suffering for the good of the Church and of reminding everyone to see in his sick brother or sister the face of Christ".

Do you know someone who is sick?

God sent Our Lady of Lourdes to show how much He cares for the sick. Fourteen-year-old Bernadette was gathering firewood by a river when she spotted a golden light coming from a nearby cave. When Bernadette came closer, she saw a beautiful lady holding a rosary. The lady spoke lovingly to Bernadette and asked her to pray the rosary with her. At first, most people didn't believe Bernadette's story about the lady. But that didn't stop Bernadette from returning to the little cave in Lourdes, France. The beautiful lady appeared 18 times between February and July 1858. She told Bernadette to pray for sinners. She also explained who she was: "I am the Immaculate Conception." The beautiful lady was Mary, the mother of Jesus! As word spread, curious crowds joined Bernadette at the cave. Only Bernadette could see Mary. One day, people watched as Bernadette scraped at the ground. A small spring of water trickled up. Mary had told Bernadette that she wanted a church built on the spot. Later, a woman with an injured arm washed in the spring. She was completely healed! This was the first of thousands of cures at Lourdes, which still pours out healing water today. As Mary had asked, a beautiful church was built there, with spires pointing toward heaven.

Let us pray for all those who are sick and in need of healing: spiritually, physically, and emotionally. May they know the healing love, mercy, and peace of Christ at this time and for those who care for them. We pray for those who mourn the loss of a loved one, may they be comforted. We turn to Mary, the Mother of God, who listens to our prayers and takes these to the Lord: Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you, Blessed are you among women and blessed if the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God pray for us sinners now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

1st Sunday of Lent 18 February 2024 'The time has come,' he said. 'and the kingdom of God is close at hand. Repent, and believe the Good News' (Mk 1:12-15)



Every day we must make choices. Sometimes it is easy to make the right choice, but other times we find ourselves being tempted to do what we might later regret. Lent is a good time to look at our lives and like a good gardener to 'remove weeds' that strangle new growth and spoil the plants & flowers; and so, allowing us to clear out all the things that come between us and God's love, for example selfishness, greed, jealousy, dishonesty etc. In Mark's Gospel the Holy Spirit leads Jesus into the desert to prepare for His mission to reveal

God's love to the world. Jesus wanted to focus all His energy and attention to God's will for the world, to draw strength from His love and to spend time alone with His Heavenly Father.

The devil wanted to disturb Jesus' peace & Satan, tried to make Jesus use His power for selfish reasons and to put God's love to the test. Strengthened by the Holy Spirit, Jesus was faithful and obedient to His Father and used the words of Scripture to convince the devil to go away and leave Him. This teaches us that Jesus is very close to us when we suffer temptation and He has suffered the same feelings of uncertainty and doubt, yet God's Spirit is ready to give us strength when we need to overcome weakness.

Beech Class - Treasure Hunt 20p a go.




World Book Day on Thursday, 7 March

Reading is **FUN**damental and an essential life skill. As a school, we place great emphasis on this and your child, regularly reads with adults in school. We would love to

All volunteers must complete safeguarding checks with me (Miss Parker), in my role as Designated Safeguarding Lead.

Weather



Please send your child/children prepared for our ever-changing weather conditions. Children must have a coat, preferably with a hood, every day, and suitable outdoor

shoes. All children must bring a water bottle to school, this will help keep them hydrated during the day.

Please be aware that if there is a closure due to snow and ice conditions this will be shared on Bradford Schools Online website, Class Dojo and Pulse Radio.

Please clearly label your child(ren)'s uniform/P.E.kit with their name, this will help to eliminate lost items – thank you for your support with this matter.

Keeping Children Safe Contact details for parents/carers.

Please make sure that if you change your phone number you inform school staff. Following safeguarding recommendations, we need at least 2 accurate contact details in the event of an emergency; accidents do happen and there are times when we are not able to contact a parent because they have not kept us informed. Thank you.

Attendance and punctuality are a huge part of keeping children safe and it is the law for schools to know why and where children are if they are not in school: schools must report children absent from school,

including parts of the day, not just absent days. As a result, systems for attendance are robust and all parents

have a responsibility to inform school of their child's absence – make sure you TELEPHONE Mrs Gadd 1st thing in the morning if your child is absent. Home visits are part of our Attendance procedures to check and do not be alarmed if safeguarding staff appear at your door. As a parent you are committing an offence if you fail to make sure that your child attends regularly. The details of parents with children who have unauthorised absence (including those who have taken unauthorised leave during term time) will be passed to Bradford Council, who could consider issuing a Penalty Notice or starting legal action. When a child meets Educational Neglect threshold then a referral to Children's Social Care can be made.

Please also be aware that parents should never collect their child during the school day because of childcare issues or for the child to attend appointments that are for a parent or sibling. As part of attendance procedures, we must record children missing during the school day.

Thank you for your support with this matter.

Arriving on time is an essential life skill and for safeguarding reasons we must lock the school gates at 8:55am – if you are arriving at that time you will have to go to the main entrance. Equally, as a school we respect parents need children to be ready for home-time at 3:15pm to collect family members from other schools or colleges; we aim to be ready to hand the children to you at that time at the end of the day and not delay you.

Late pick-up charges

There is a late collection charge £1, per child, for every 5 mins you are late; sadly, some parents have been persistently late and without good reason; taking the view that it is okay for school staff to take responsibility for children after the school day. Unfortunately, we do not offer childcare after 3:15pm and many staff finish at the same time the pupils leave. Congested traffic, in town shopping, a late taxi, forgetting the time, having a hair colour on at the hairdressers are not acceptable reasons to be late for your child. We are understanding, if there are exceptional reasons and it is not usual for you to be late and we appreciate a phone call from you if you are going to be late, it re-assures the child as well. After school teaching staff have meetings, work to do following the school day and in preparation for the next day.


